Col. Jeffery Greb entered military service in the United States Army in May of 1980. After serving for a few years as an Infantryman in 2-104th Infantry Regiment, Col Greb received his commission as a second lieutenant in the Massachusetts Army National Guard in August of 1983 through the Massachusetts State Officers Candidate School.

Col. Greb has during his time of commissioned service seen various duty assignments to include Company Command, as Battalion Commander of 1-181IN, and as the Brigade Commander of the 26th Infantry Brigade Combat Team. Col. Greb recently returned from overseas after serving as the Deputy Commander of the 29th Infantry Division during the KFOR8 (Kosovo Force 8) deployment to Kosovo, from July of 2006 to November of 2007, and currently serves as the United States Army Reserve liaison to Vermont for Homeland Defense.

Col. Greb has also received the following awards during his time in service: Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal (with 2 Oak Leaf Cluster), Army Commendation Medal (with 3 OLC), Army Achievement Medal (with 2 OLC), Massachusetts Medal of Merit, NATO Non-Article Five Medal, Kosovo Campaign Medal, Global War On Terror (GWOT) Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal.
